THE VENUE Foz do Iguaçu, Brazil

Foz do Iguaçu is a modern and cosmopolitan city, host to numerous ethnic groups. The second destination for leisure tourism in Brazil, the city receives annually more than a million visitors of about 160 nationalities.

One of the city's technological attractions is the Itaipu Plant, one of the world's largest hydroelectric plants in power generation. Foz do Iguaçu hosts approximately 600 events per year - including trade shows, conferences, conventions, and technical, scientific, sporting and cultural events. Foz do Iguaçu is the sixth major hotel cluster in Brazil, with over 26,000 beds. It also offers one of the country's best infrastructures for hosting events.

Iguaçu Falls, located in the south-west of Brazil, bordering Paraguay and Argentina, is listed as one of the Seven New Wonders of Nature. With a flow rate of up to 45 million liters per second, Iguaçu is the world's largest waterfall, and a worship place for Guarani Indians since ancient times.

Surrounding the falls, Iguaçu National Park is listed as a World Heritage Site by UNESCO since 1980, and is one of the last subtropical rainforest reserves in Southern Brazil, hosting many endangered species of fauna and flora.


