Pamplona and its surroundings

Pamplona has a Roman origin and is in the Way of Saint James. Its bi-millennial history has led it to be a modern, calm and welcoming city, endowed with monuments and historical passages, centuries-old walls, and with an appreciated gastronomy. Among the historical buildings, the medieval walled enclosure or the Citadel, considered the best example of military architecture of the Spanish Renaissance. Pamplona has many green areas and parks that make it a very pleasant city for tourists.

The old Reyno of Navarra presents evergreen valleys such as Roncal or Baztan, beautiful and colorful forests such as the impressive Irati Forest, Orgi or Quinto Real and gorges of vertigo as in Lumbier or Arbayún.
